HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 212

BY REPRESENTATIVE FUTRELL AND SENATOR DARDENNE

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To recognize October 1, 2001, as World Peace Day in the state of Louisiana.

WHEREAS, the members of the Legislature of Louisiana recognize the need to address violence throughout the world, including violence within communities and violence among nations and cultures, in order for the people of Louisiana and the rest of the world to benefit; and

WHEREAS, there is a universal desire of all peoples for peace within families, peace within communities, peace among nations, and peace within the human heart; and

WHEREAS, people from all walks of life throughout the world have long struggled against the use of violence and have promoted peace among individuals and nations; and

WHEREAS, the Institute of All Nations, Inc., a private, nonprofit corporation, permanently chartered by the regents of the state of New York, under the co-chairmanship of former United States Supreme Court Justice Arthur J. Goldberg and former United Nations Ambassador Arthur S. Lall, with Professor Rama C. Mohanty of Louisiana as general secretary, adopted a resolution that World Peace Day be observed internationally each October 1, beginning in 1998; and

WHEREAS, observance of World Peace Day in Louisiana is designed to raise mass awareness against violence at home and abroad, to recall the innocent victims of violence and to show support for their families, and to

recognize and promote peace workers, peacemakers, and peace organizations that have struggled and continue to strive to end violence, improve the human condition, and bring greater peace and well-being to communities, families, and individuals in the state of Louisiana, in particular, and the world in general; and

WHEREAS, peoples, communities, organizations, churches, chapels, temples, synagogues, mosques, and institutions of worship will come together in conference, workshops, and conventions on October 1, 2001, to create mass awareness against violence, honor those who have worked and continue to work in the promotion of peace, and joyfully celebrate the message of peace with open hearts.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby recognize October 1, 2001, as World Peace Day in the state of Louisiana, does hereby commend and encourage continuing quality work against violence in this state and everywhere, and does urge all citizens and all community organizations of Louisiana to join in this observance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the 2001 World Peace Day Committee for Louisiana.
