Proclamation

WHEREAS,

the continuing observance of this day in Louisiana is designed to bring mass awareness of and increased support against violence and for peace workers, peace makers, and peace organizations that have worked and continue to work to end violence, and to bring greater peace and well-being to communities, families, and individuals, in Louisiana, in particular, and the world in general; and

WHEREAS,

people, including the future leaders, the youth of Louisiana, communities, organizations, and institutions will come together in marches, workshops, conferences, and conventions to create mass awareness against violence and in support of caring, cooperation, peace, and harmony and to honor those who have worked and continue to work to this end.

I, Bobby Jindal, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do hereby proclaim




